14:15 – 16:15 During the boat trip, you will explore the port of Riga – the largest port in Latvia and the second largest port in the Baltic States. In 2022, 23.5 million tons of various cargo were handled in the port, which is 49% of all seabound cargo handled in Latvian ports. The strategically advantageous geographical location, well-developed connections for all transport modes and diverse logistics solutions provide the Freeport of Riga with the status of a multimodal transport hub and multifunctional port, as various types of cargo – dry bulk cargo, liquid bulk cargo and general cargo – can be handled at its terminals. The main types of cargo handled in the port of Riga are timber, containers, agribulk and coal.
